COLLEGE LIBERATION PICNIC FRIDAY 8TH MAY

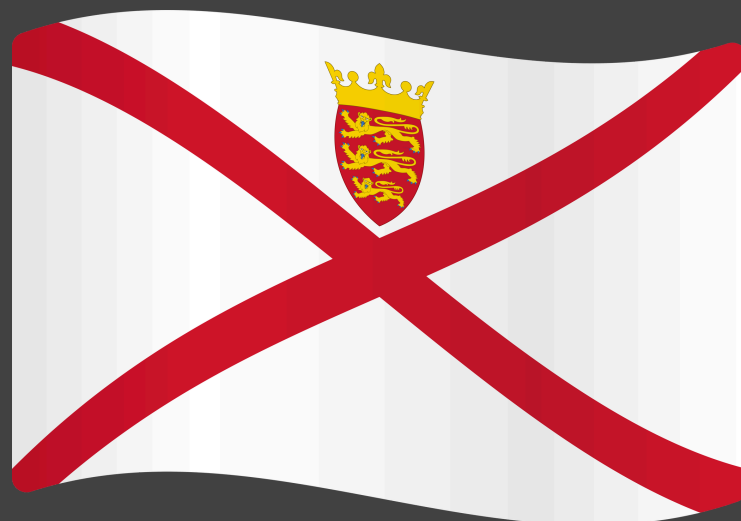
We are delighted to let parents know that pupils in JCP and JCG will be taking part in a shared Liberation Picnic on Friday 8th May (weather permitting!).

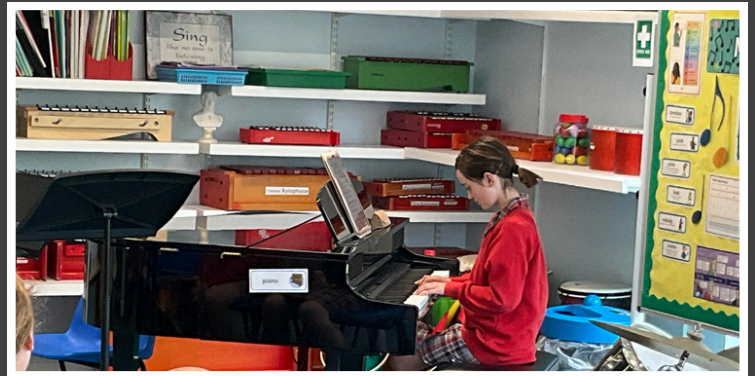

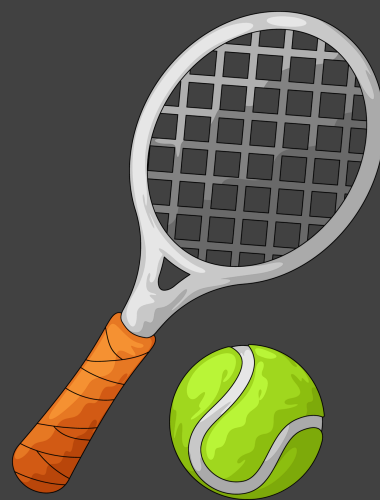
