Have a wonderful weekend and, for those watching, come on England!



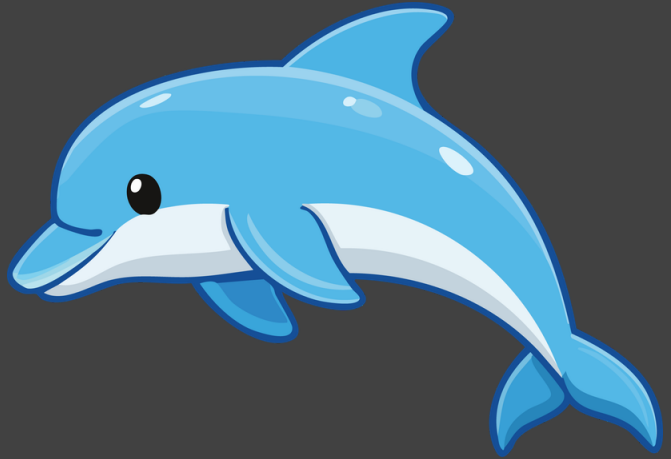

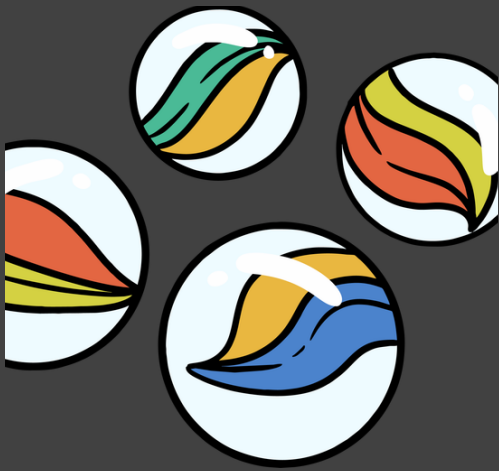

THIS WEEK IN SCIENCE

Year 5 have been exploring the life cycles of different organisms, with this week's focus on birds and reptiles. They were fascinated to dissect a raw, unfertilised egg, identifying key structures including the inner and outer membranes, albumen and the chalaza.

They also learnt how the inside of an egg changes once it becomes fertilised, giving them a deeper understanding of how new life develops.

Year 5 and Year 6 were also in for a real treat this week when we welcomed Mr Braithwaite, Head of Science at JCG, along with two of his Science Prefects, for an exciting "whizz, bang" science assembly!

There were plenty of oohs, ahhs and even a few loud bangs as they demonstrated the wonders of science in action. It was an inspiring and memorable experience for everyone involved!

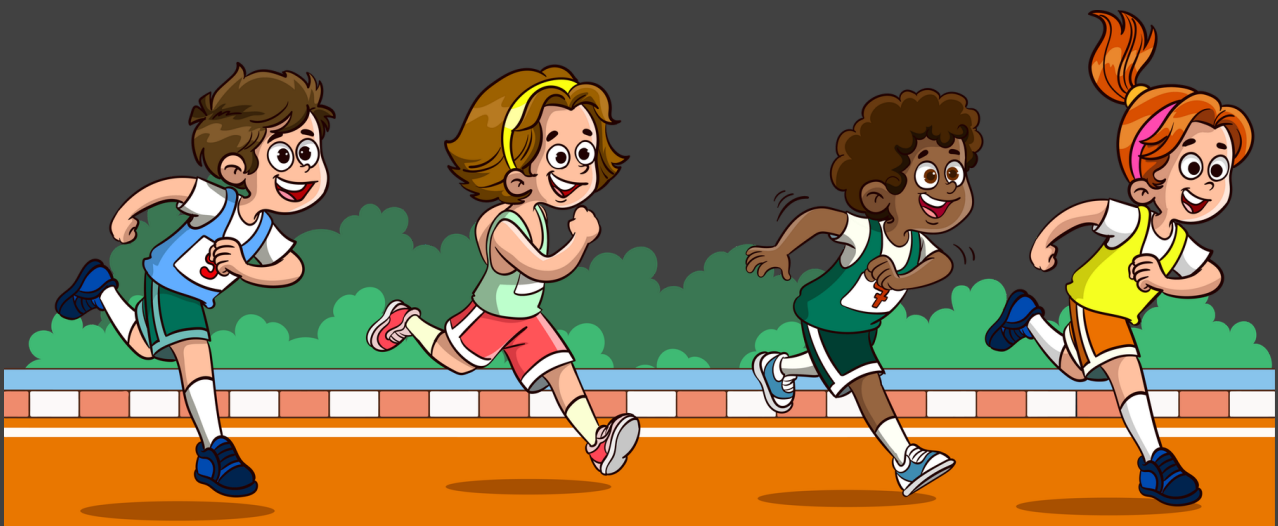
