We are really looking forward to welcoming you all to the Summer Fayre next Friday 12th June at 13.00. Fingers crossed for good weather!

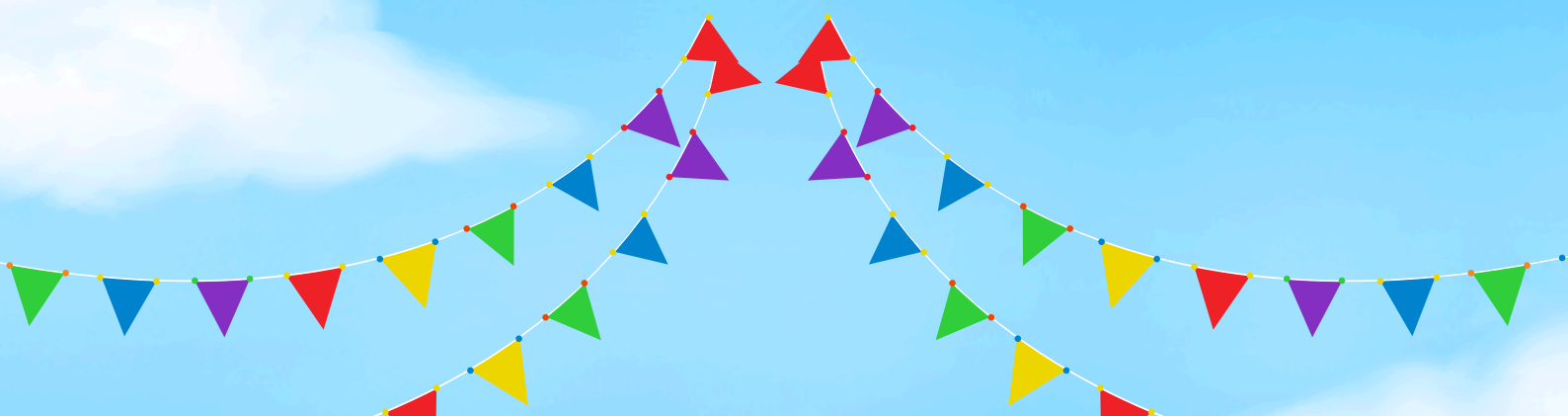

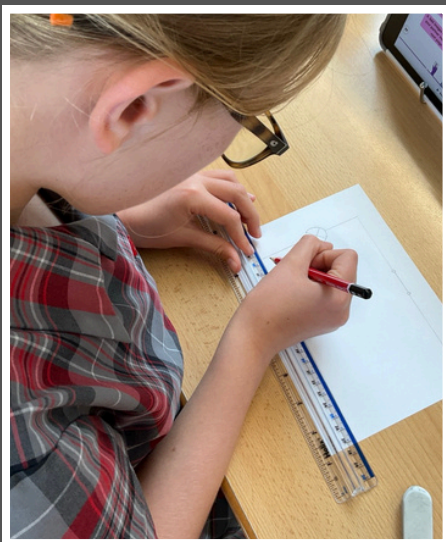

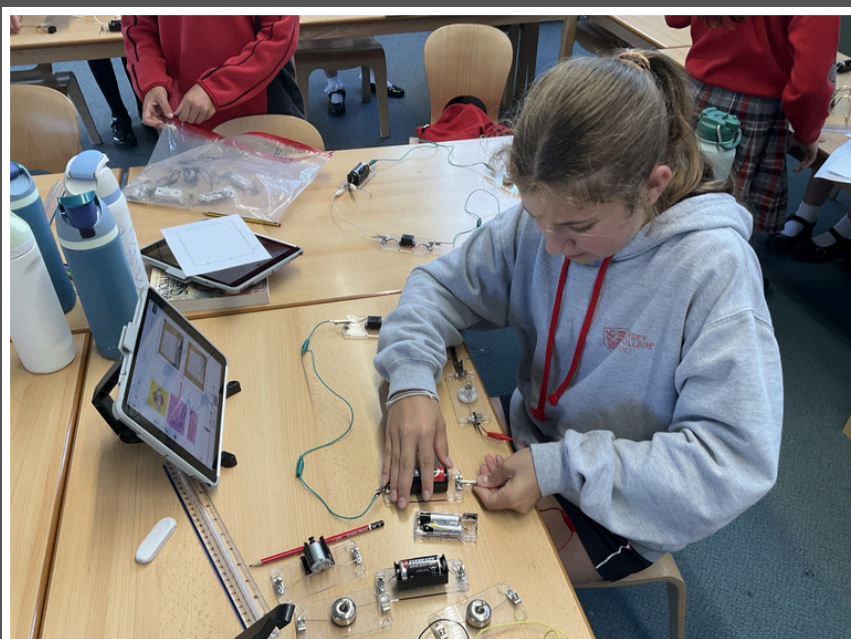
