Sun Safety



Now the sunnier weather is starting to make an appearance, it is important that children are well protected during the school day. The sun's rays are particularly strong in Jersey over the summer, and they can damage children's skin. Too much sun exposure can lead to skin cancer in later life.

Your child's health and well-being are very important to us, which is why we:

- Provide more shade in the playground and encourage pupils to use the shade of the trees and structures during outside activities.
- Encourage children to wear hats when outside.
- Encourage children to use a high factor children's sunscreen in summer months.

- Talk to your child about the importance of sun protection and teach them to apply sun cream carefully.
- Send your child to school with a sun hat (named and preferable wide-brimmed).
- Apply sun cream to your child before school in the summer months, even if the day starts out dull.
- Send your child to school with additional sun cream in a named container.
- Send your child to school with a named water bottle.



It is not possible for one teacher to apply sun cream at breaks and lunch to 20+ children. Even if application took one minute per child, break would be over before half the class had left the classroom. For this reason, it is vital that your child comes to school with waterproof sun cream already applied. We will, of course, supervise children who wish to top up their sun cream, and encourage them to do so carefully at lunch times if it is necessary.

We will also remind the children to drink plenty of water, stay in shady areas and wear their hats.

Together I hope we can have a very happy and safe term to come!

National Day and an Anthem for Jersey



in January the Government issued a survey which had questions about whether the song 'Beautiful Jersey' should be formally adopted as Jersey's anthem and whether Liberation Day should be formally adopted as Jersey's national day. L'Office du Jèrriais undertook outreach work to ten local schools on behalf of the consultation, collecting 1,207 survey responses from young people with 215 survey responses completed by JCP students. The States Assembly voted on this proposition on 18th March.

Overall, the consultation received 2,466 responses. Liberation Day received overwhelming support with 2,007 respondents (82%) in favour of designating 9th May as Jersey's official National Day. The States Assembly also voted to adopt "Man Bieau P'tit Jèrri" as an anthem for Jersey.




Ariyana (6P) recently entered the Ambassador of St Helier competition and did really well in her section: giving an excellent speech about her suggestions for ways to improve St Helier.


