World Children's Day Celebration

The Office of the Children's Commissioner for Jersey and the Youth Advisory Group (YAG) for Jersey celebrated UNICEF World Children's Day on Thursday 21st November.

This year was a special milestone for Jersey, as it marks ten years since YAG adopted the United Nations Convention on the rights of the child, committing to protect and promote the rights of all children on the island.

It was an incredible opportunity for young people to proudly represent the voices of children and advocate for the progression of children's rights in Jersey.

'I Have a Voice' by Ariyana, Year 6P



This was the finest football the A team had played so far this season. Well done to Charlotte who was named player of the match.






