True Grit Wetwheels Challenge



The True Grit Wetwheels Challenge returns on **Sunday 30 March 2025** at the Ronez Quarry site on Jersey's rugged North coast.!

This challenge is a 4.7KM running race with a difference. The route consist of different obstacles that will make you crawl, carry, climb and jump your way to the finish!

There is also a short obstacle course (approx 2K) open to children in Year 4+ and a long obstacle course (approx 4K)open to children in Year 6+.

The challenge raises funds and awareness Wetwheels Jersey, which provides the opportunity for all disabled people, including those with profound and complex disabilities, to access the sea in a safe, stimulating and rewarding way on board a specially built, fully accessible powerboat.
