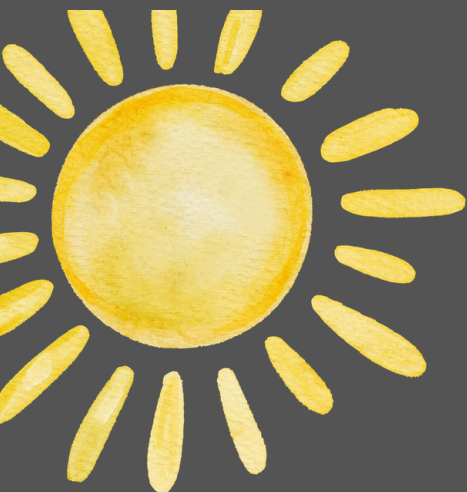
To help keep everyone cool and comfortable, children are welcome to come to school in their PE kit on Monday and Tuesday. Please can we ask parents to ensure that children:

YEAR 4 GEOGRAPHY TRIP

Year 4 had an action-packed Geography day at Ouaisné Beach on Tuesday! They teamed up with JCG to hunt for nurdles and beach waste, learned more about Jersey's coastal management from Mr Binney, and even tested their own erosion-prevention ideas, deciding that the best form of defence was the sea wall. A quick game of rounders wrapped up a brilliant day of learning outdoors.



THIS WEEK IN SCIENCE

It has been another exciting week of scientific discovery across the school!

Reception used the handprints they created last week to investigate the length and width of their hands. Using multilink cubes, they carefully measured and compared their results before ordering their hand lengths alongside those of their classmates.



Year 3 became solar energy engineers, testing the efficiency of their DIY solar ovens. Fortunately, the weather was perfect for the investigation! Some ovens reached a scorching 50°C , successfully melting their chocolate. The children discovered that adding insulation and extra reflective materials improved the ovens' efficiency by trapping and directing more heat.



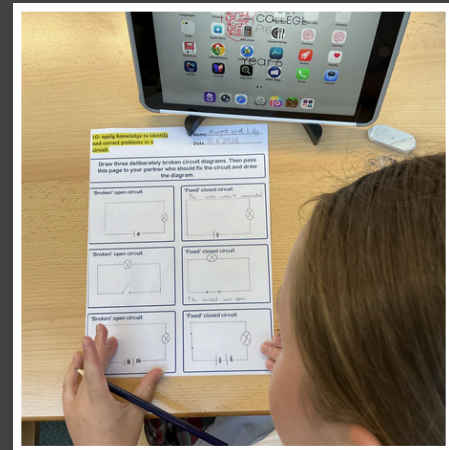
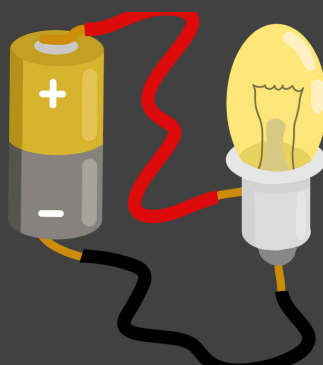
THIS WEEK IN SCIENCE

Year 4 explored the impact of air pollution around our school. They set up 'pollution catchers' in different locations, including by the main road, in the underground car park and in Forest School. By comparing the particles collected and observing noise levels in each area, they began investigating the relationship between traffic, noise and pollution.



Year 6 took on the role of electrical engineers, investigating faulty electrical circuits and identifying problems. They then repaired the circuits and produced accurate scientific diagrams to show their corrected designs, demonstrating their understanding of how electrical components work together.

PRIMARY ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

This week, 15 different children from Years 5 & 6 have taken part in the Primary Schools Athletics championships, held at the FB fields. The children have taken part in sprint races, distance races, relay races, throwing competitions, long jump competitions and high jump competitions. It has been a physically tough week for those involved, and they have represented JCP brilliantly all week.

On Monday 15th June, the children took part in various running heats, in which they were trying to qualify for semi-finals and finals later in the week.

First up came the sprint qualifying rounds. It was a dry afternoon, however rain earlier in the day had made track conditions a little slippery under foot, leading to a few stumbles. The JCP children performed extremely well in the first round of the sprints, with all 8 year 5 & 6 sprinters qualifying for the quarter-finals of the competition, which was held later that afternoon.

Next up came the distance races. In the Year 5 600m, Elsie and Emily were pitted against each other in the semi-final, however both ran fantastically well, finishing 1st and 2nd respectively, securing them both a place in the final.

In the Year 6 800m, Milleigh endured tough racing conditions in her semi-final, but managed to hold her composure to win her semi-final.

Poppy also ran superbly in her semi-final, finishing 2nd and also securing her a place in the final.

The day finished with the sprint quarter finals. In the Year 5 75m quarter finals, Tilly G, Tilly B, Harriet and Abbie finished 1st, 2nd, 2nd and 3rd respectively, earning them all a place in the semi-finals later in the week.

In the Year 6 85m quarter finals, Cecily, Hattie and Halle finished 2nd, 4th and 4th respectively, earning them all a place in the semi-finals later in the week.



PRIMARY ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

On Tuesday 16th June, the children took part in relays, high jump, long jump and throwing competitions.

The relays were a huge success. Both Year 5 & 6 relay teams won their semi-finals convincingly, therefore qualifying for the final. The Year 5 team (Abbie, Harriet, Elsie & Tilly B) were the first of our teams to race in their final. They ran an incredible race throughout, with fairly smooth changeovers, and even though it was a close race at the end, Abbie showed great grit and determination in the final leg to hold off the competition. The team were therefore crowned Jersey champions!

Next up came the Year 6 relay team (Hattie, Halle, Poppy & Milleigh). Again, the team ran incredibly well. A couple of sticky change-overs meant that the rhythm was disrupted a little, but the individual speed of our runners really shone through. Milleigh picked up the baton in the final leg in second place, a fair way behind Beaulieu, however she ran incredibly hard down the back straight and almost took the win for JCP, but Beaulieu were crowned champions after an agonising photo finish.

The JCP throwers were also fantastic throughout the afternoon. In the Year 5 competition, Emily finished 2nd overall in the whole competition with a huge throw in excess of 32m.

In the Year 6 competition, Isla finished 4th overall in her competition, with a huge throw in excess of 33m. The long jump competitors needed lots of patience in an extremely busy event which took some time to finish.

We are still awaiting confirmation of the results from the competition.

High jump made a return to the championships for the first time in about 3 years. Our children performed extremely well, despite only have a couple of practise sessions. Well done to Milleigh who finished 3rd in the competition, jumping a new PB of 1m 20cm.



PRIMARY ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

On Wednesday 17th June, the JCP children competition in the semi-finals/finals of their respective races, on a very hot afternoon.

First up were the semi-finals of the sprint events. In an incredible achievement, all 4 Year 5 children that were entered into the sprint competition qualified through to the final. Tilly G won her 75m semi-final, whilst Harriet, Tilly B and Abbie finished 3rd, 3rd and 4th respectively in their races.

In the Year 6 85m semi-finals, all the children ran incredibly hard, with Hattie finishing 4th in her race to qualify for the final.

Next up saw the much anticipated distance finals. First up was the Year 5 600m final. Elsie and Emily both started well, and ran much of the race in 2nd and 4th place. Both athletes stuck to their own individual race plan, and with about 300m left to go of the race, really started to kick on and catch the athlete out in front. With 200m to go, Elsie passed the front-running athlete and commanded the lead all the way to the finish. Emily dug incredibly deep to pass the runners in front of her and hold them off until the finish line. Elsie was crowned Jersey champion, and Emily the Jersey runner-up.

Next up came the Year 6 800m final. Milleigh and Poppy both ran fantastic races. Milleigh ran off the shoulder of the leader for the first lap, with Poppy sitting comfortably in 3rd place. As the final lap progressed, Milleigh started to apply pressure to the leader, and with about 150m to go, kicked on to overtake the leader and commanded the lead until the finish line. The battle for 2nd place was incredible, and with 300m to go, Poppy started to close in on the leading duo as she powered on to try to catch them. Poppy battled all the way to the finish and was agonisingly close to catching the 2nd place runner. Milleigh was crowned Jersey champion, and Poppy finished in 3rd place.

The week finished with the sprint finals. The Year 5 sprint final was an incredibly close affair. The winner was clear on the day, but the other places needed to be awarded through photo finish evidence. Our children ran incredibly hard and had to battle each other for positions. Congratulations to Harriet, who became the Jersey runner-up, but the other JCP runners performed incredibly well too, with Abbie finishing 4th, Tilly G 5th & Tilly B 6th in the whole of Jersey!

The last event of the day saw Hattie represent JCP in the Year 6 sprint final. She was nervous, but ran her heart out. Hattie finished 8th in the final, which is an amazing achievement.

Congratulations to everyone that represented JCP throughout the course of the week.
