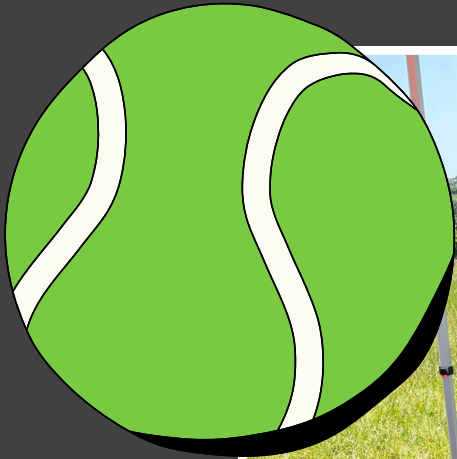

# CONGRATULATIONS LE SUEUR HOUSE



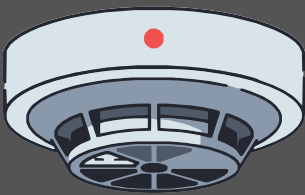

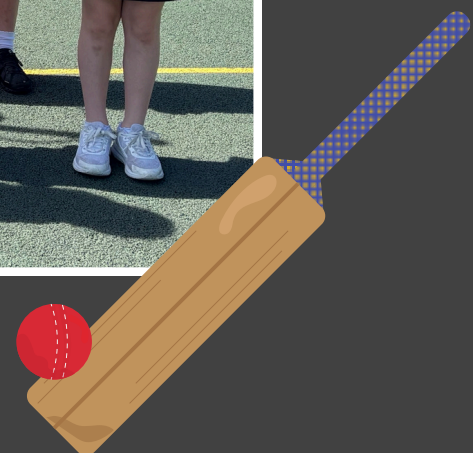
# CRICKET CLUB

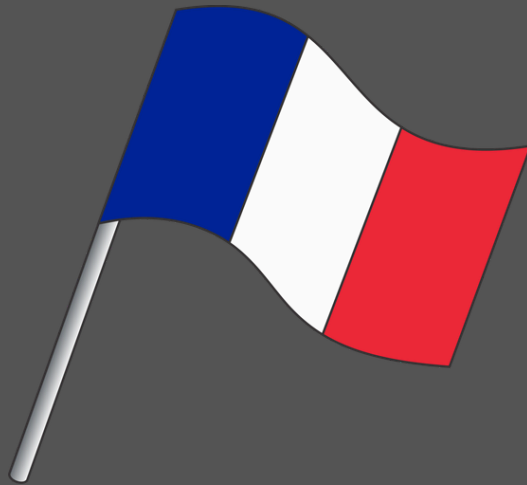

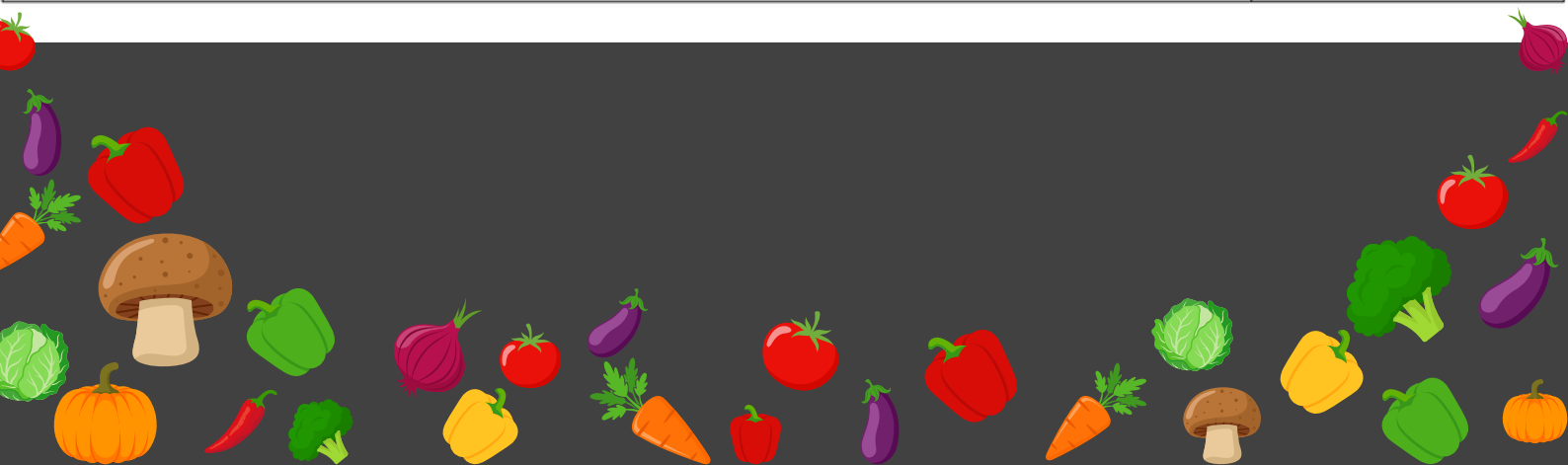
