HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

It is a daily occurrence to see both parents and children carefully (and sometimes hopefully) sifting through our ever-growing lost property cupboard. Despite our best efforts, children have a remarkable talent for putting items down in the most imaginative of places — under benches, behind bookcases, or apparently nowhere near where they were last seen. As a result, a wide variety of items make their way into lost property, including coats, jumpers, water bottles and snack containers.

We always try to reunite items with their rightful owners, but this becomes almost impossible when items are not named. 
We'd love to invite parents and carers to our next PTA meeting, which will take place on Friday 27th February at 8.15am.

WORLD BOOK DAY




Huge congratulations to Year 6 for winning 2 trophies: 'Top Scoring School' and also 'Most Improved School' following their Safety in Action workshop last summer.


We were delighted to welcome Mandy from Child Accident Prevention, Jersey into our assembly to award the trophies as well as give us books about electricity and safety.

Thank you to Susan Parker for overseeing the project and supplying the cup cakes!





BIRD SPOTTING
