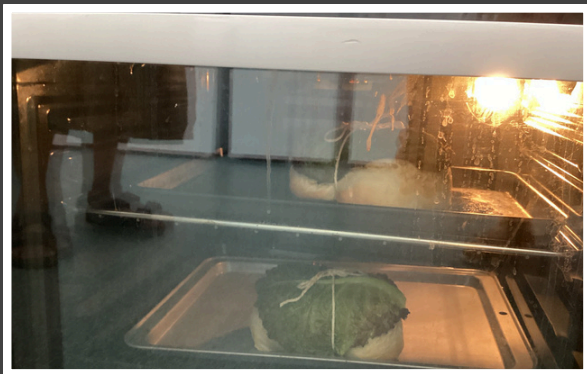

YEAR 4 CABBAGE LOAF

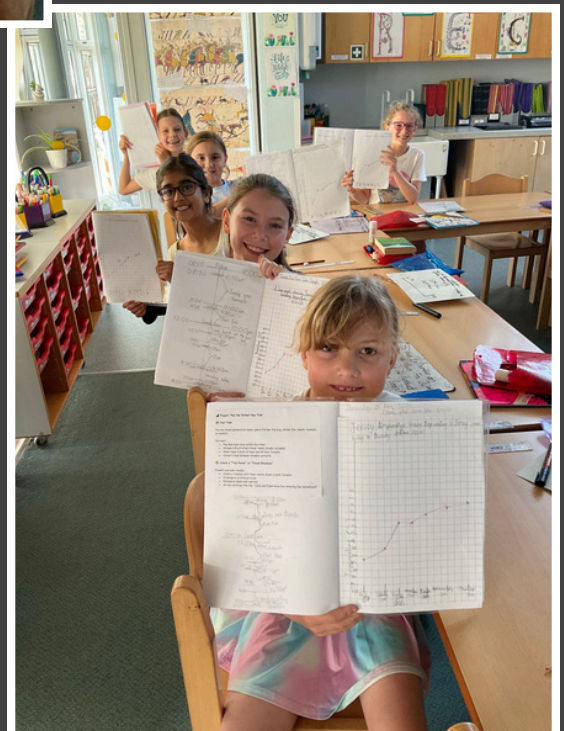
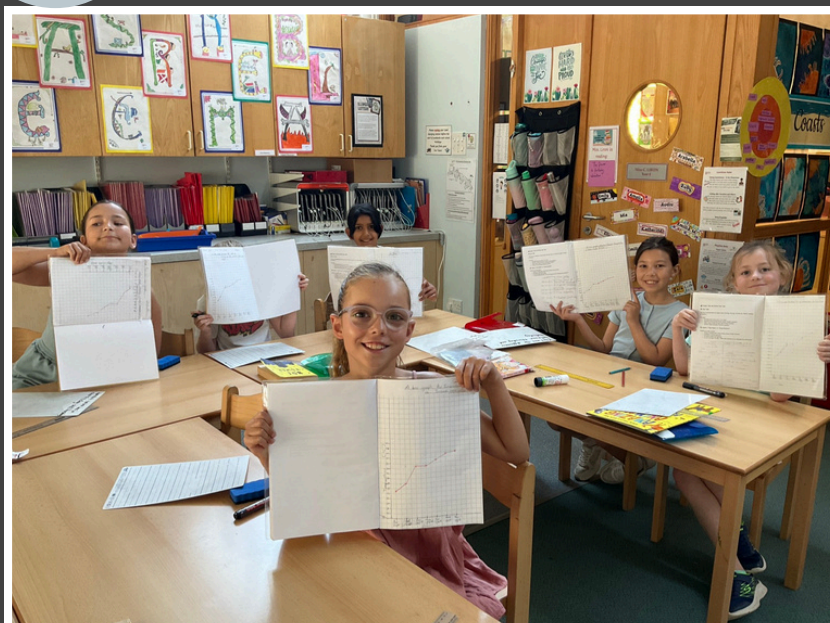
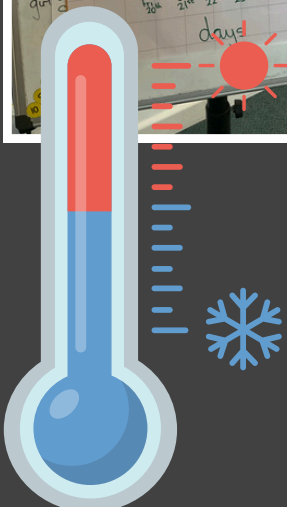
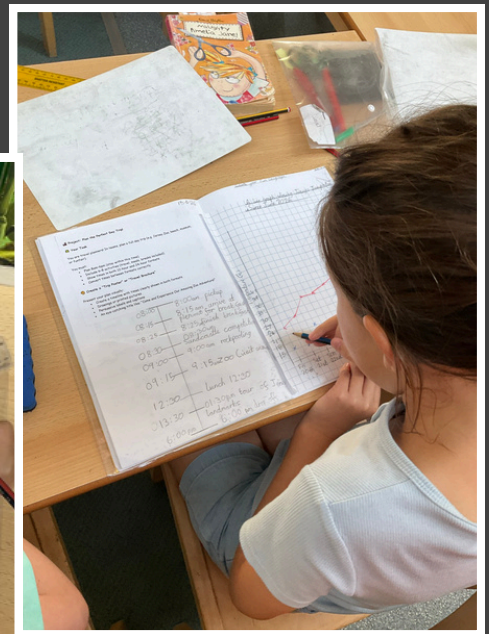
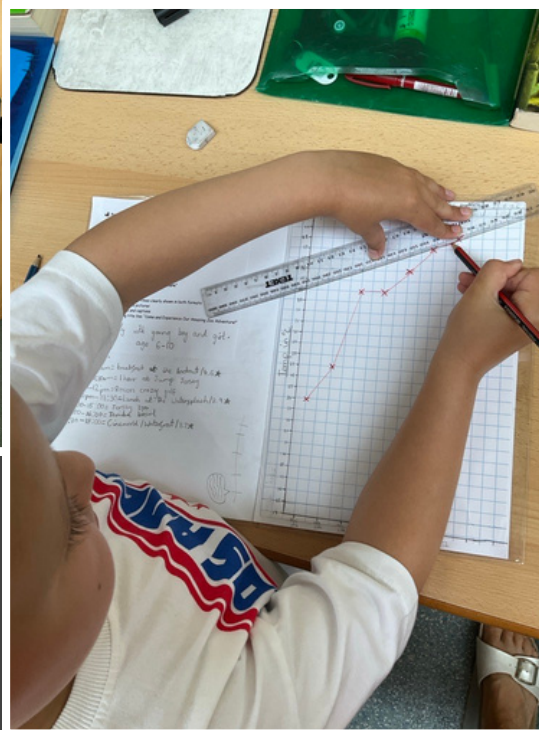
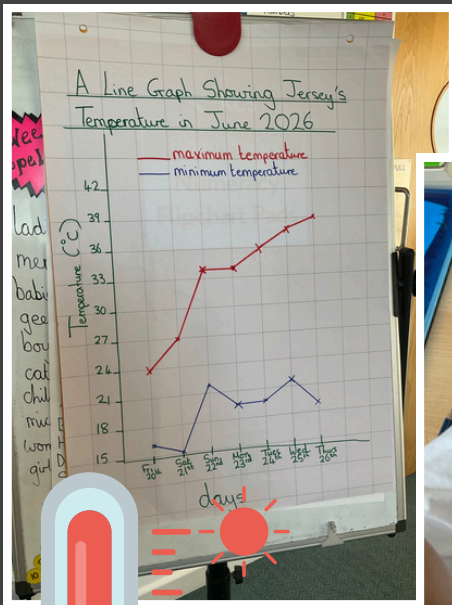

Working in groups, pupils carefully weighed their ingredients, kneaded their dough, and made sure it proved beautifully in this hot weather! YEAR 4 MATHS WORK THIS WEEK

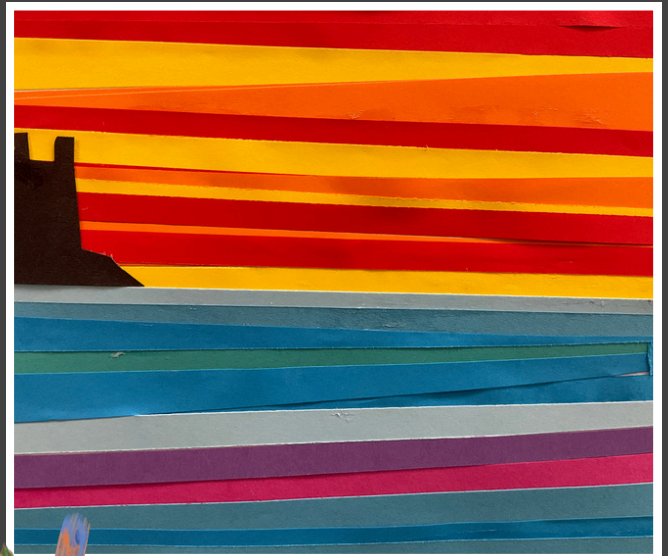
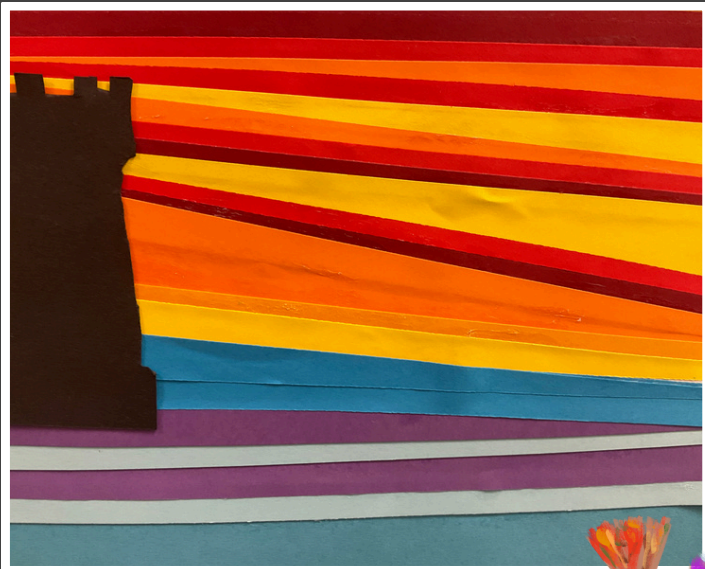
This week, Year 4 put their statistics skills into action by exploring the record-breaking temperatures we've been experiencing! ☀️🔥

THIS WEEK IN SCIENCE



Our new science mural is complete! A huge thank you to Rory McCann for creating this stunning piece, beautifully showcasing many of the scientific topics explored across JCP. Following his 'creative spark' and initial drawings, Rory drew inspiration from the fantastic work of our Year 6 Science Leaders, who researched a wide range of living organisms from amphibians and insects right through to protozoa!

There is a time - lapse video (can be seen on the social media platforms) of the mural taking shape, turning pupils' ideas and scientific enquiry into a vibrant celebration of discovery and the natural world. We can't wait for our school community to experience it in person and for our students to use it as a focal point for learning—deepening their understanding of science, inspiring curiosity and encouraging discussion about the world around them.

In addition, classes had the opportunity to visit the mural with Rory, where they explored the artwork up close, ask questions about his design process and learnt more about the key features and scientific ideas that inspired different elements of the piece.

We are incredibly proud of the collaboration, creativity and enthusiasm for science that made this project possible. 🌍🦋🌱🧬✨



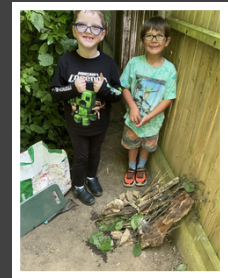
THIS WEEK IN SCIENCE

I am not sure the weather is quite right for these just yet...



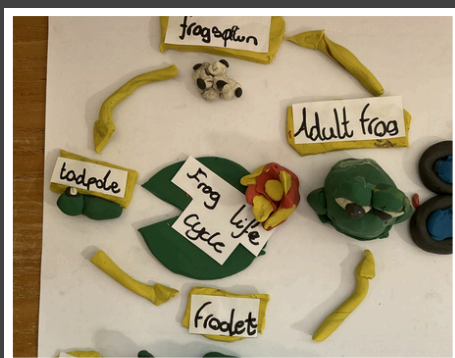
Year 2 investigated the rainforest, creating informative posters about the threats it faces and how we can help protect it. 🌳🌍

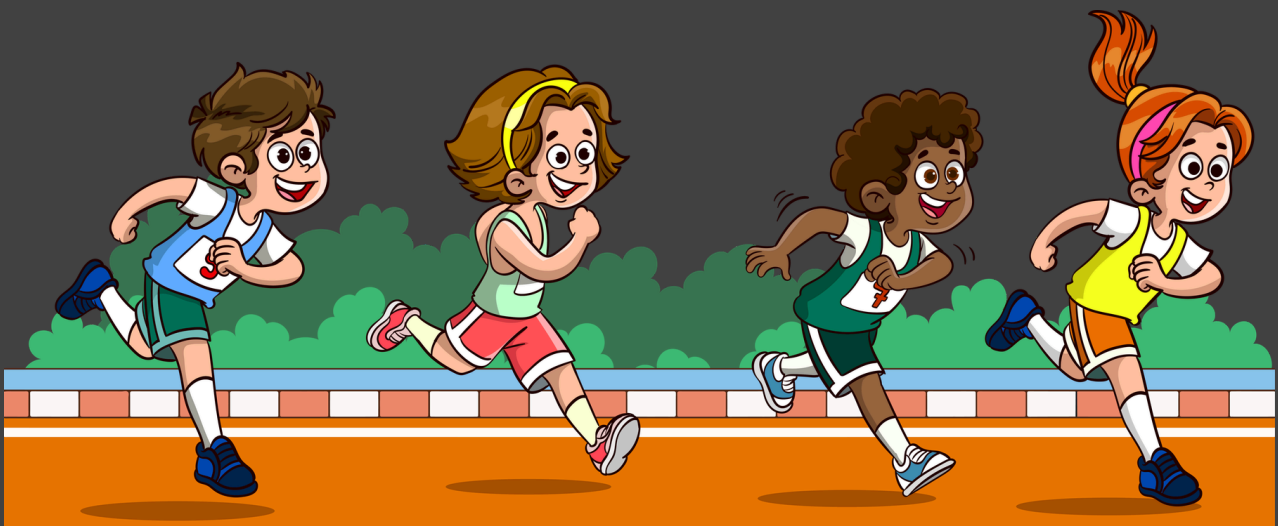

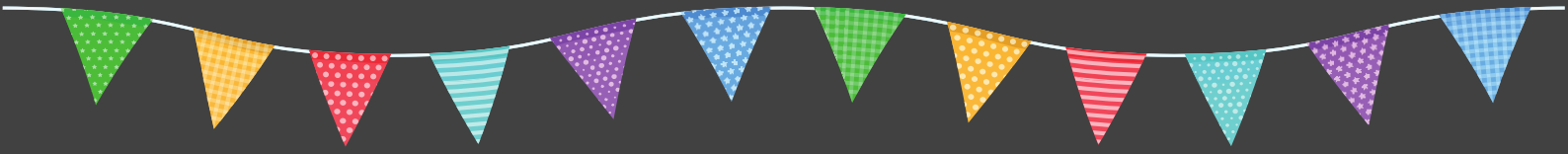

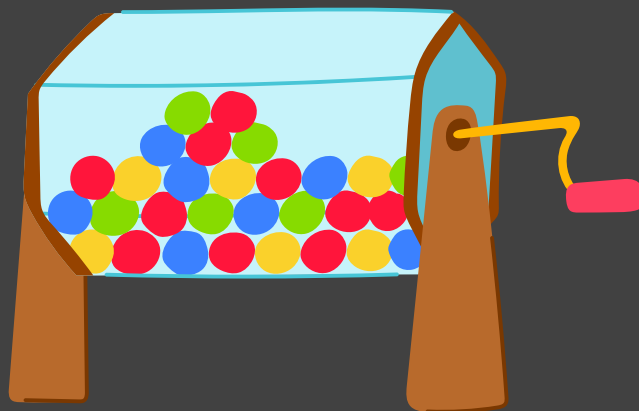

BACK TO SCHOOL BONUS 2026

Applications now open!

To support Islanders with the cost-of-living pressures, the Government of Jersey is providing financial support to help families with the cost of preparing children for the new school year in September 2026.

The payment is intended to help with expenses such as uniforms, shoes, stationery and other back to school essentials.

You may be eligible if:

- Your child is in Reception to Year 11
- Your child attends school in Jersey
- Your household income is £75,000 or below (based on 2025 income)

Eligible families will receive:

- £100 for each primary school child
- £150 for each secondary school child

Key dates:

- Applications open: Monday 15 June 2026
- Applications close: Friday 31 July 2026

Families currently receiving Income Support do not need to apply.
Payment will be made automatically.

Families who are not receiving Income Support and may be eligible can apply online now.

Payments will be issued as a single lump sum in August, in advance of the new school term.
